Gunnise Genrice EASTER DAY



INTRODUCTION

It's a tradition within the Christian faith to do a sunrise service on Easter for it was early in the morning that the women and the others found the tomb of Jesus Christ was empty. The sunrise not only reminds us of the raising of Jesus Christ, the light of the world, from the dead but also the call on all believers to share that light so that all may see it and know that Jesus Christ is Lord and his resurrection is for all people.

The service should begin before dawn, so that the sunrise can be part of the worship. The Easter Light should be lit at the first signs of dawn to emphasise the power of the light of Christ.

It is suggested that alongside this liturgy and a means to listen to the suggested hymns you bring with you a candle to light as the sun rises reminding us of the light of the world that can never be put out, our Lord Jesus Christ.

The service is designed to be led by two people with one reading the words of the liturgy, the other reading the passages of scripture, and both joining together with everyone else present for the sections marked for all. If there is only on person reading then say all the words of the service sheet.

The sections in *red italics* are rubrics: these explain what needs to happen at various points.

SUNRISE SERVICE

LORD OF CREATION

Lord God,
early in the morning,
when the world was young,
you made life in all its beauty and terror;
you gave birth to all that we know.

¹ In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth... ³¹ And God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.

Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and wall the host of them. ² And on the seventh day God finished his work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all his work that he had done.

LORD OF THE INCARNATION

Lord God,
early in the morning,
when the world least expected it,
a newborn child crying in a cradle
announced that you had come among us,
that you were one of us.

⁹ The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. ¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. ¹¹ He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. ¹² But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, the gave the right to become children of God, ¹³ who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

⁵ Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, ⁷ but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. ⁸ And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Phil. 2:5-8

HYMN: BROKENESS ASIDE Listen here

All Lord God, we give thanks for your crucifixion.

Silence is held until the sun starts to rise.

A candle is lit as the sun rises. The service then continues.

LORD OF THE RESURRECTION

Lord God,
early in the morning,
a voice in a guarded graveyard
and footsteps in the dew
proved that you had risen,
that you had come back
to those and for those
who had forgotten, denied and destroyed you.

³ Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ!
According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, ⁴ to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, ⁵ who by God's power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.

HYMN: CHRIST OUR HOPE IN LIFE AND DEATH Listen here

All Lord God, we give thanks for your resurrection.

Christ is risen!

Alleluia! Alleluia!
